Common Schools.

T a meeting of the Board of Superintendents, held on the 20th of April, and an adjourned meeting held on the 25th of April, 1857:

Present—Edw'd Lee Winslow, Hon. Lauchlin Bethune, William McMillau, Philemon Taylor, J. T. Waren, Clerk of the Board:

The accounts of the Chairman for the year 1856 were examined and found correct. Edw'd Lee Winslow was appointed Chairman for the ensuing year, and J. T. Warden Clerk.

The following resolutions were unanimously adopted: Whereas, the division of the county of Harnett from Creek, Woodrun Creek, Clark's Creek, Rocky Creek,

the county of Cumberland renders it necessary that ADVERTISEMENTS inserted for sixty cents per the School Districts in the county of Cumberland be remodeled and re-numbered, inasmuch as by the running of the line many of the Districts are divided, and those on Little River are rendered inconvenient to ficiency to the Common School system in the county, that a map of the School Districts be prepared for the use of the Superintendents, and a copy thereof be filed in Raleigh with the General Superintendent: Therefore Resolved, That the Board of Superintend-

ents appoint the Chairman of the Board, with J. T. Warden, Clerk, to engage the services of a competent School Districts of a convenient size, and that in doing so he be requested to have regard to the location

of the School Houses now erected.

Resolved, That the Hon. Lauchlin Bethune, in the western part of the county; James McKethan, Esq., on the eastern side of Cape Fear River, and William McMillan, Esq., in the southern part of the county, be requested to give such aid as they can do.

Resolved, That the Board of Superintendents of the county of Harnett be requested to establish Lower Little River, up to the point where the line between Cumberland and Harnett ends on the river, as the di-viding line between the School Districts in the two Resolved. That the Committee cause two plots to be

nade, one for the use of the Board of Superintendents, and that the other be sent to the General Superintendent at Raleigh. Resolved, That as soon as the Committee have had the survey completed, the Board shall meet to con-

firm the report, if they shall approve the same.

Resolved, That after the said Districts are numered and the report accepted and confirmed, elections shall be held in the several Districts for Committeemen, or the Board may appoint them, as they are authorized to do by law, in cases of no election; and af-ter the lists of the children are returned to the Chairnan and the number ascertained, the money coming

On motion, Resolved, That the Chairman be requested to send a copy of the third resolution to the Board of the county of Harnett, and ask their concurrence.


