BOARD OF VALUATION Of the Fayetteville and Cross Creek Districts,

OCTOBER 3, 1859. THE Board of Valuation for the Fayetteville and Cross Creek Districts have decided, that they will be able o make a valuation of the Real Estate more satisfacto-

ily if they sit together.
Therefore Resolved, That in the valuation of real estate they will act as one Board.

The following extracts from "An Act entitled Revenue" are published for general information:

SEC. 4. "The owner of the land, or (if he be a nor resident) his agent shall furnish the district board with a list, including land entries, setting forth the separate tracts, and also the several contiguous bodies or tracts of land owned by him in the district, together with the names of the water courses, or other noted places on, or nearest to which they may be situated, and the number of acres in each separate tract or contiguous body of land."

SEC. 5. "Town lots shall be listed separately, and each lot be numbered according to the plot of the town. Each separate body or tract of land, and each town los shall be separately and distinctly valued and returned." Sec. 7. "If any person shall refuse to furnish the list equired above, or to take the oath prescribed in the receding section, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and the justices of the peace of said board shall bind him over to appear at the next term of the Superior Court of the county to answer the charge; and, on conviction or submission, he shall be fined at the discretion of the court.

Sec. 8. "When the owner of the land, or (if he be a on-resident of the State) his agent, be not a resident of the district where the land is situated, the required list, with affidavits of the same import as the above required oath, subscribed and sworn to before and certifi ed by a justice of the peace, may be transmitted to the district board of valuation, and if received before the ket Square, No. 12, next door to the Carolinian Office. Oct. 3, 1859.

sworn to by the owner or agent in person."

Sec. 9. "When the board of valuation are not furnished with a list sworn to as above required, or the the statement as to the number of acres contained in any tract of land, they may procure a county or other surveyor, and have the same surveyed. And the sur-veyor may recover the amount of his fees and all expenses out of the owner of the land, before a justice of the peace, by warrant or attachment."

Resolved. That all persons, owners, guardians, attorneys, agents and trustees, are hereby notified that cor-rect lists of real estate, specifying the District in which the land is, must be handed in to the Boards on or before the 25th day of October 1859.

Resolved, That the Lists be handed to Joseph Arey, Esq., who may be found at the Town Hall, from the 5th

November, shall have prompt attention, and all persons may rely upon getting just the kinds they wish.
