

The matter has been a good deal condensed, by ounditing whatever seemed theoretical rather than practical, by dispensing with such of the English statutes as have no bearing upon American law or practice. The notes in their present form contain, however, a large amount of new matter, and several subjects are introduced which were not treated in the former edition. The authorities have been carefully re-examined, and all of the re-ported, and numerous manuscript cases in each of the several states, down to the date of publication, added. The criminal statutes of sixteen of the states have been digested and distributed under the appropriate heads, together with such English statutes, the construction of which from their similarity to our own, seemed likely to aid the American practitioner. A concise outline of all the more important cases cited by Mr. Archbold has also been given; thus presenting, in a convenient and accessible form, all of the leading English criminal
