Incidents of the Charleston Fire.

Richard Dereef, (colored drayman) during the fire offered a dray to a woman whose household effects were immediately exposed to the fire.

One old colored drayman, who was driving a load, was offered a large bonus for his dray, with a promise of fourfold payment for the load.

The dwelling of Capt. Thomas Ryan, in Archdale street, was saved in his absence by the faithful and persevering efforts of his servants.

The conflagration was the occasion for developing many exhibitions alike of the fidelity of the negro born and reared on our soil, and of the strength of his local attachments.

A Noble Act.—We learn that a drover who arrived at Charlotte, N. C., with one hundred head of beef cattle for another destination, upon hearing of the conflagration at Charleston, immediately obtained the consent of the Railroad Company to transport them here, and has turned the whole over to the Relief Committee.
