WEST POINT SOLDIERS.

The following particulars of the history of prominent officers of the Confederate and United States graduates at the Military Academy at West Point, are believed to be reliable.

Each cadet after graduating is entitled to the rank of 2d Lieutenant, his commission bearing date according to his proficiency in his studies, in drill, &c. The discipline and standard of scholarship are very high, as may be inferred from the fact that, on an average, about two-thirds of the cadets who enter the Academy are dropped in the four years' course, from ill health, had continued laziness or inability to keep pace with their more able classmates.

CLASS OF 1815. Samuel Cooper, of N. Y., entered artillery; Lt Colonel for gallant conduct in Mexico; compiler of a work on Tactics; Adj Gen C S A.

CLASS OF 1818-23 MEMBERS. Richard Delafield, of N. Y., No 1, entered Engineers; member of board of Engineers since 1845.

CLASS OF 1820-30 MEMBERS. John H. Winder, of Md., No 11, entered Artillery; brevetted Major 1847, for gallantry at Contreras and Churubusco; Brig Gen C S A.

CLASS OF 1825-37 GRADUATES. Daniel S. Donelson, of Tenn., No 5, entered artillery; resigned 1826; councillor at law; planter in Ala, since 18.

CLASS OF 1830-40 MEMBERS. Robert Anderson, of Ky., No 15, entered artillery; brevetted Captain for gallantry in Seminole war; severely wounded at Molino del Rey; brevet Major for gallantry in that battle; Major when in command of Fort Sumter, then Brig General U S A.

CLASS OF 1835-40 MEMBERS. Joseph R. Anderson, of Va., No 4, entered artillery; transferred to Engineers 1836, resigned 1837; Civil Engineer 1838-41; superintendent of Tredegar Iron Works 1841; Brig General C S A, resigned.

Major 1st Regiment Va Volunteers in Mexican War; now Brig General U S A.

CLASS OF 1828-33 GRADUATES. Hugh W Mercer, of Va, No 3, entered Artillery, resigned 1835; Cashier of Planters' Bank, Savannah, since 1841; Brig Gen C S A.

CLASS OF 1829-45 MEMBERS. P G T Beauregard, of La, No 2, entered Artillery, 2d Lt Engineers 1838; Bvt Capt for gallantry at Contreras and Churubusco; Bvt Major at Chapultepec; wounded at the Belen gate in entering City of Mexico; now General C S A.

CLASS OF 1830-42 MEMBERS. Paul O Hebert, of La, No 1, entered Engineers, resigned 1845; Chief Engineer of State of La, 1845-47; brevetted Lieut Colonel Infantry 1847; disbanded 1848; now Brig General C S A.

CLASS OF 1831-33 GRADUATES. Samuel R Curtis, of Ohio, No 27, entered infantry, resigned 1832; Civil Engineer for many years; Councillor at Law; Colonel of 3rd Ohio volunteers in Mexican war; member of U S House of Representatives; now Brig General U S A.

CLASS OF 1835-40 MEMBERS. George Meade, born in Spain, cadet from Pa, No 19, joined artillery, resigned 1836; reappointed 2d Lieut Topog Engineers 1842; brevet 1st Lieutenant for gallantry at Monterey; now Brig General U S A.

CLASS OF 1836-40 MEMBERS. Joseph R Anderson, of Va, No 4, entered artillery; transferred to Engineers 1836, resigned 1837; Civil Engineer 1838-41; superintendent of Tredegar Iron Works 1841; Brig General C S A, resigned.

CLASS OF 1837-50 MEMBERS. Henry W Benham, of Conn, No 1, entered Engineers; wounded and brevetted Capt. for gallantry at Buena Vista; Brig Gen U S A. Dismissed. Braxton Bagg, of N O, No 5, entered Artillery; Brevet Lt Colonel for gallantry at Buena Vista; now Brig General C S A.

CLASS OF 1838-45 MEMBERS. Robert E Lee, of Va, No 2, entered Engineers; Assistant Astronomer for demarkation of Boundary line between Ohio and Michigan, 1835; Chief Engineer of Gen. Wool's army in Mexico; Brevet Major for gallantry at Cerro Gordo; Brevet Lt Col at Contreras and Churubusco; Brevet Col at Chapultepec, where he was wounded; member of Board of Engineers; now Commanding General C S A.

CLASS OF 1839-51 MEMBERS. Isaac J Stevens, Mass, No 1, entered Engineers; Brevet Capt for gallantry at Contreras and Churubusco; Bvt Maj at Chapultepec; severely wounded at City of Mexico, Assistant in the Geodesic Coast Survey; Governor of Territory of Oregon; member of House of Representatives from Oregon; now Brig Gen U S A.

Major 1st Regiment Va Volunteers in Mexican War; now Brig General U S A.

CLASS OF 1840-42 MEMBERS. John C Pemberton, of Pa, No 27, entered Artillery; brevet Captain for gallantry at Monterey; brevet Major for gallantry at Molino del Rey; now Brig General C S A.

CLASS OF 1841-52 MEMBERS. Josiah Gargas, born in Pa, cadet from N. Y., No 6, entered Ordnance; now Chief of Ordnance U S A.

CLASS OF 1842-50 MEMBERS. John F Reynolds, of Pa, No 26, entered Artillery; Brevet Captain for gallantry at Monterey; brevet Major at Buena Vista; now Brig General C S A.

CLASS OF 1843-50 MEMBERS. Robert S Garnett, of Va, No 27, entered Artillery; brevet Captain for gallantry at Monterey; brevet Major at Buena Vista; Brig General C S A, killed at Rich Mountain.

CLASS OF 1844-50 MEMBERS. Nathaniel Lyon, of Conn, No 11, entered infantry; brevet Capt for gallantry at Contreras and Churubusco; wounded at the Belen Gate, City of Mexico; Major General U S A, killed at Springfield.

CLASS OF 1845-50 MEMBERS. Samuel S Anderson, of Va, No 18, entered Artillery; brevet Captain for gallantry at Molino del Rey; Lieut Colonel C S A.

CLASS OF 1846-50 MEMBERS. William T Sherman, Ohio, No 6, entered Artillery; now Major General U S A.

CLASS OF 1847-50 MEMBERS. Ambrose P Hill, jr, of Va, No 15, entered Artillery; now Major General C S A.
