27th N. C. TROOPS.
FOR THE OBSERVER.
HEADQUARTERS 37th N. C. T., Feb. 10, 1864.

Messrs. E. J. Hale & Sons: At a meeting of the 37th Regt. N. C. Troops, the following Committee having been appointed to propose resolutions for the consideration of the meeting:

Resolved, That we are still determined that our country shall be a free and independent nation, notwithstanding the absurd proclamations of Abraham Lincoln; and we do hereby pledge anew our property, our lives, our honor and our all, never to submit to abolition tyranny nor Yankee rule.

Resolved, That we originally enlisted as a regiment for twelve months because we believed our country needed us in the field; that we afterwards re-enlisted for two additional years of the war before the Conscription Bill had been introduced in Congress because we thought we still needed us, and that we are now actuated by the same feelings to tender to the Government our country, our services in the field for the war unconditionally and without reserve.

Resolved, That we are perfectly satisfied with the present organization of our army and have unlimited confidence in the skill, bravery and patriotism of our Generals.

Resolved, That while we endeavor to do our duty we shall expect the authorities to do theirs: we shall expect them to see all deserters and strikers from our ranks shot at the stake in disgrace; we shall expect them to allow us to visit our homes once every twelve months, at such times as the exigencies of the service will permit; and we shall expect them to feed, clothe and shoe us and not allow worthless substitutes to make us suffer by their inaction.

Resolved, That we are ready to endure without a murmur all necessary hardships and privations which the good of the cause may demand.

Resolved, That we call confidently upon all good people at home to give us their sympathy and support, and send us food to sustain life, and recruits to fill our ranks.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the Congress of the Confederate States, to the Secretary of War through the regular official channels, to His Excellency Gov. Vance of N. C., and the newspapers for publication.

The above resolutions were then submitted to the Regt. and opportunity was allowed for a full and fair expression of opinion; when it was found that out of nearly 500 who were present only about 10 were opposed to the resolutions. The resolutions were accordingly declared adopted and the meeting adjourned.
