If the estimate of the Battleboro Advance be correct, to wit, fifty thousand tons, then the people of the State expend three millions of dollars annually in the purchase of this one article!

Now if the North Carolina Fertilizer Company is organized and sustained by our farmers, we will be able to retain this vast quantity of circulating medium at home.

The plan appears to us to be feasible, and if successfully prosecuted, will redound to the interest of all classes of our citizens-but especially to the farming community.
