

THE MONTREAL GAZETTE AND IMMIGRATION.

We received a copy of the Montreal Gazette several days ago, containing an article on immigration, which commented severely on the depreciation of Southern bonds, and gave that as a reason why European settlers were driven from the Southern States.

We had before this received several anonymous communications from Montreal to the same effect, which we did not notice because they contained unjust reflections upon North Carolina for not making provision to pay her State debt, and assailed in exceedingly harsh terms her honesty and good faith.

Editorials in favor of immigration that have appeared from time to time in the DAILY NEWS, were cut out and returned to us from Montreal, with comments by probably the same writers who sent us the anonymous communications. Their letters sometimes enclosed us the quotations of North Carolina bonds in the New York markets, and the question was asked, how could we expect immigrants to come to a State whose financial credit was at such a low ebb?

We treated these articles with silent contempt because we believe they were written either by the holders of North Carolina bonds or by some one in their interest, and were unaccompanied by responsible names.

We notice that the Montreal Gazette, with the article on immigration referred to above, has also been sent to two of our State cotemporaries, the Wilmington Journal and the Hillsboro Recorder. Both of these papers made some comments on the subject. We should have done likewise but for the fact that we believed the article in the Gazette was written or suggested by the same individuals who have been sending us communications from Montreal, of the same tenor with the editorial in the Gazette. The gist of the article is to show that North Carolina cannot expect Europeans to settle among us until the State debt is provided for. The Wilmington Journal made some very sensible remarks on that point, to the effect that as greatly as we desired the tide of immigration to turn towards our State, yet if as a condition precedent it shall be required of us to pay the fraudulent debt contracted by the swindlers who had stolen our bonds and ruined our State credit, it would be sometime before we received our quota of immigrants.

A gentleman of this city who read the editorial in the Hillsboro Recorder on the subject of immigration hands us the following communication, in reply to which we publish it:

"Solomon said there is nothing new under the sun. According to Biblical chronology, 1,400 years before Christ, a certain tyrant of Egypt named Pharaoh, required the Israelites to make him a large quantity of bricks, at the same time refusing to supply them with the necessary material. They tried hard, but could not do it, so tyrant Pharaoh cowed them. Not liking that kind of reward for their labor, they mildly remonstrated, laying their shortcomings on his people's shoulders. He shouted, 'ye are idle, ye are idle, go therefore, now and work, for there shall no straw be given you, yet shall ye deliver the tale of bricks.' Some pious women and sensitive men have looked on this act of Mr. Pharaoh as rather a little too hard, and sympathizing with the poor Israelites, in some countries it has become a saying, that 'a man can't make bricks without straw.' The Hillsboro Recorder has been playing the character of Pharaoh on our Commissioner of Immigration, who has to act the part assigned the Israelites. In Wednesday's paper, an article headed 'Immigration,' charges the Commissioner of this State in almost Pharaoh's words, with idleness and selfish schemes. It would appear by the build of the article, as if two writers had been engaged on its construction—one for Pharaoh and one for the poor Israelites, for it states that no straw had been furnished; in other words, no compensation for services has been provided the Commissioner, and adds the novel announcement that 'patriotism these days needs the stimulus of pay.' If patriotism is the word for devoting time and talent, mind and means, to the public service, it is true, that it does in these days, and will for the future, as it did in the past, require the 'stimulus of pay.' 'Thou shalt not muzzle the ox when it treadeth out the corn,' was one of God's commandments. The laborer is worthy of his hire, is also prescribed from our pulpits. It has been the boast of Americans that officials were the paid servants of the people; yet there is one State in which the rule is an exception, or at least one office, and that no sinecure, one which adds immediate wealth to the State. Not a cent of remuneration has been given or offered for office rent, clerk hire, or personal service, yet the tale of bricks is insisted upon.

The inciting cause of this editorial is an article copied from the Montreal Gazette entitled 'Immigration South and North,' which calls attention to the energetic efforts being put forth by Virginia to attract English and Scotch immigrants. Contrary to the statement of the Hillsboro Recorder, it gives North Carolina with Tennessee, credit for making some efforts to attract immigrationals. The Canadian paper is better informed than our neighbor what is taking place in this State. Although the full 'tale of bricks' has not been delivered, a very considerable share of English immigration has come into this State, and that of a very superior quality. Around Kildgeway and Henderson, as well as in the immediate neighborhood of this city, every month has brought its contributions. Our stores, banks and churches can all testify to this. Last Sunday week we counted near a score of English coming out of the P. E.

THE WALWORTH HORROR.

The New York papers are filled with the details of the Walworth horror. Since the murder of Fisk, that city has not enjoyed such a great sensation. The murder of Walworth by his own son is pronounced one of the most horrible crimes ever committed, and the high respectability of the Walworth family invests all the circumstances with unusual interest.

Mrs. Walworth left Saratoga for New York on Thursday to visit her son, who is now in confinement in a felon's cell, for the murder of her husband. The sympathy of the people at Saratoga is altogether in favor of the wife, who is said to be a most estimable lady.

Young Walworth, the murderer, is devotedly attached to his mother—his attachment amounting almost to idolatry. His peculiar affection for her incited him to avenge her wrongs and insults by the commission of this most awful crime against his own father and the laws of his country.

He is said to be perfectly calm and cheerful in prison, although the excitement in the city is unabated.

CLAIMING THE HONORS. It will be seen from the correspondence between Gen. Ross, commanding the militia of the State of Oregon, and the Governor of that State, published in to-day's telegrams, that the militia claim all the honors of finishing up the Modoc war.

Where now is General Davis, with his Warm Spring Indians and his Modoc deserters? The Governor of Oregon asks that those Indians captured by the militia in the recent fights who have been indicted in the State Court be turned over to the civil authorities for trial, and that the others be delivered to the United States army headquarters.

EUGENIE'S APPEAL. Napoleon's private Secretary denies that the Empress has published an appeal to the people of France in behalf of her son, the Prince Imperial. The article in the Pall Mall Gazette to that effect, which was referred to in the dispatches yesterday, is pronounced utterly untrue.
