The General Assembly of North Carolina do enaol:

SECTION 1. That all claims against the several counties, cities and towns of this State, whether by bond or otherwise, shall presented to the Chairman of the Board be presented to the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners or to the chief officer of said c ties and towns, as the case may be, within two years after the muturity of such claim or claims or the holder of such claim or claims, shall be forever barred from recovery thereof. Provided, That claims which have already

matured, and become due shall be presen ted on or before the first day of January, A. D., 1877, or the holders thereof shall be forever barred of a recovery thereof. Section 2. That it shall be the duty of the
