THE ROANOKE RIVER .- A Weldon correspondent, under date of yesterday, says:

VALUABLE PLATE FOUND .- A COFrespondent, writing us from Tarboro, Savs :

"Dr. A. H. McNair, of this place, day before yesterday was gratified to learn that a quantity of silver-ware, which had been in the family a number of years, buried by him during the war about a mile from the town of Louisburg, where he was "refugee ing" at the time, had been found and awaited his order. Soon after the Yankees had left for more genial parts, search was made, but some one previously found out the place and appropriated the hidden treasure. the Doctor thought. There were 27 pieces, and as all were marked with the initials 'A. H. M." it is presumed the thief feared to dispose of them; at any rate, they were concealed in the

loft of an old tenement house, which being overhauled a few days ago for repairs, the ware was discovered by an acquaintance of Dr. McNair's, who notified him immediately by mail. The value of the silver is over \$500."

says : "A most atrocious deed was committed in this county last week by a fiend (for he certainly should not be classed with human beings) by the name of Humphrey, who is now lodged in jail to awalt the action of the grand jury. 
