It was, and is, not only the right, but the duty of Congress to examine and judge of the election returns and qualifications of the applicants for seats in that body from the Southern States.

Removed Rapture Between the President and Stanton.

WASHINGTON, July 10, P. M.—The President received visitors today. There are rumors of a rupture between the President and Stanton, consequent on the arbitrary measures of the latter in the case of Paymaster Paulding.

The President directed him to stay proceedings until the Bureau of Military Justice could review the case and report to him, and issued an order for Paulding's immediate return.

Stanton also dismissed three Paymasters—L. A. Cook, Dodge, Jameson and Ely—who testified before the Court in defence and justification of Paulding.
