DEATH OF A FORMER CITIZEN OF RALEIGH. Col. Benson F. Jones died suddenly, at his residence in Chesterfield, Va., on the 14th inst., in the 67th year of his age.

STATE LIBRARIAN.—We learn that Theo. H. Hill, Esq., having been notified of the extraordinary fact that it would be necessary for him to take the "iron-clad," before entering upon his duties as State Librarian, by virtue of the appointment of the Trustees, (the Governor and the Judges of the Supreme Court,) on yesterday tendered his resignation.

THE MEELE.—Since Cuffee Mayo, the African delegate from Greenville, was summarily squelched, the other day, when he rose to "expatiate" in the great sanctified, the public have been agog to know what it was that Cuffee wanted to say, Halifax and Bertie, also, have not been heard from.

COMMITTEES. Of the twelve Standing Committees of the Convention, appointed by Mr. Cowles, the President, six of the Chairmen are Northern men, who have recently come into the State, viz: Heaton, Sweet, Abbott, Tourgee, Welker and Ashley.

IN GEORGIA the newspapers are calling upon the Convention, now in session at Atlanta, to do something for the oppressed people of that State. One paper says that over one-half of the property and homesteads are in the hands of the sheriffs, and that one-half of the families will soon be made homeless by these villains, unless the Convention arrest the proceedings of creditors.

THE FISHERMEN.—The North Carolina fishermen have recently made heavy catches of sea-herring in the market, preparatory to the commencement of the fishing operations, to begin in a few weeks.

STANTON NOT TO BE RECOGNIZED BY THE PRESIDENT. The President will resist encroachments by Congress with all the power at his command.

WASHINGTON, JAN. 21, P. M. Mr. Stanton continues to sit as Secretary of War. I learn officially that he is not and will not be recognized by the President.

THE FLORIDA "SO-CALLED." The delegates to the Convention met at the Capitol on yesterday, having a quorum in attendance. The temporary officers were all approved.

GRANT PROPOSES TO SEE WALL. The National Intelligencer of Saturday says: "We stated on Wednesday the plain facts in reference to the promises of Gen. Grant to the President in regard to the Stanton affair. We reiterated this statement yesterday morning."

FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21, P. M. In a conversation respecting the present situation and his future prospects the President said: "A modification—perhaps I might say a decided change—of public sentiment in the North has been the consequence. One who held fast to a principle, when a majority was arrayed against him, is not likely to loosen his hold upon it, when so much of the pressure has been removed."

CONGRESS. WASHINGTON, Jan. 21, P. M. House. After ineffectual efforts to amend, supported by Butler, Stevens and Kelly, the Reconstruction bill, as reported by the Committee, passed—Yeas 128, Nays 42.

Mr. Sumner presented a petition from citizens of Texas, alleging that the Federal officers of that State are non-residents and generally not in sympathy with the Union men but favor the policy of the administration.

THE PRESIDENT was requested to inform the Senate, whether James A. Seddon, whom the President has recently pardoned, was Secretary of War of the Confederate States, who was keeper of the Andersonville prison, and also how many Union soldiers died from starvation and other cruelties inflicted in violation of civilized war, during Seddon's Secretaryship.

SUPREME COURT. WASHINGTON, Jan. 21, P. M. In the ex parte McClellan case, Chief Justice Chase announced that a majority of the Justices thought that the motion of the applicant should be allowed, and ordered that the case be advanced on the docket and assigned for a hearing on the first Monday in March.

VIRGINIA CONVENTION. RICHMOND, Jan. 21, P. M. The Convention spent the day in debating and voting on the Bill of Rights.

SOUTH CAROLINA CONVENTION. CHARLOTTEVILLE, Jan. 21, P. M. The Convention adopted a resolution requesting Canby to suspend the sales of property, under execution, for three months.
