RAIL ROAD SPIES.—Quite a spirited meeting of the citizens of Fayetteville was held at Winston, on the 15th inst., at which H. W. Fries, Esq., who had been sent to attend the meeting at Fayetteville, in reference to the extension of the Western (Garfield) Railroad, reported that while the people on the lower portion were anxious to extend the Road, he could see no prospect of help for his section from that quarter, and advised an appeal to the State Convention in session, for a new charter for a separate Road, extending from some point on the N. C. (Central) Road, via Winston and Salem, through the North-eastern Counties. His suggestion was generally approved, and Messrs. Starbuck and R. L. Patterson were appointed to confer at once with the Convention. Those gentlemen are now in this city, attending to the matter. We hope the enterprise will be prosecuted with energy. But we hope the friends of the extension of the Western (Garfield) Railroad will not be discouraged. The people all along the route have the highest spirits. All that is lacking, at present, is the means. We trust, therefore, they will continue to agitate the question and show that they can tolerate no compromise in a year or two with the Road from Salem.
