**THE STATE ELECTION.**  
Proofs of irregularity, deception and willful fraud in the conduct of the late election, are constantly coming in from every quarter. The character of these irregularities is various, indicating every conceivable effort to defeat the Unionist.

This determination to act fraudulently exhibited itself on the threshold, when the first registration began, in the readiness with which young negroes were admitted to registration, without adopting any systematic and reliable method of ascertaining definitely their true ages. We have heard the opinion expressed, and it is a reasonable one, that thousands of negro boys under 21 years of age have been permitted to register in the State.

Moreover, the times, places and circumstances of registration, particularly in the last instance, were very unfavorable to the obtaining a fair registration. The places of registration were so distant, in the last instance, that many white men were unwilling to travel the distance to effect it. Five days were allowed for registration, and when the time closed, while some of the Registrars very properly declined to admit any others to registration after that time, other Registrars continued, singly and alone, to register the names of all who presented themselves. At many places, registration was continued after the election comment.

Besides this, many persons are believed to have voted more than once, but most generally under feigned names. There is no doubt in the minds of many gentlemen, that the plan of Gen. Canby, allowing voters at all points to vote upon their own affidavits, was a most fruitful source of fraud.

**THE FRAUDS.**  
While we were thinking of the wholesale frauds that have been committed in the late election, and especially in this County, and despairing of being able "to do justice to the subject," we picked up the New Orleans Crescent of the morning after the day of the election in that city, which contains the following, which meets the case and we adopt it bodily.

The infamous carpet-bagger excelled himself in infamy yesterday. Frauds have heretofore been perpetrated at elections, and attempts upon the purity of the ballot box have not been unfamiliar in our past political history; but those who have resorted to these expedients have, usually, preserved some show of decent respect for public opinion. But the carpet bagger did not try to hide their rascality beneath even a thin veil of concealment. They organized in the face of the public, and partially consummated a gigantic scheme of swindling, by which they hoped to subvert the will of legal voters. So audacious, indecent and flagrant a conspiracy to carry an election by open and unblushing fraud was never before seen in this country, and we trust that it may never be seen again.

**THE RESULT.**  
At the time of writing this paragraph, we have seen nothing to shake our opinion that the people of North Carolina have repudiated the infamous Constitution. We await further returns, which come in but slowly, with profound interest.
