## Our Washington Correspondence.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 25, 1868.  
MRS. EDITOR.—Those who reside at a distance from the erupting scenes, and vicarious indigence of Washington, can form no adequate conception, either of the extent or power of the political pressure which has been exerted upon the impeachment trial through Radical influence. The more conservative portion of this party is said to be composed of some ten or eleven Senators, who are in truth opposed to conviction, and *in fact independent* of party power, would cast their votes against it. These men, however, from a high sense of honor, and influenced from the double corruption of policy, durability, and gain, have yielded to the weight of the difficulties which must result from this measure, to the future progress and interests of their party. Upon these Senators, who are supposed to be the leaders, the concentrated strength of party power and influence has steadily and unfeignedly been brought to bear, through every channel and agency in the possession of desperate and insidious party men.

For these purposes, the bold, astute, shrewd, and avaricious *are the most influential and active* members of this party, representing almost every interest and department of the world composed both sexes, have gathered at the point as the grand field of operations. Irreconcileable, hot-headed, impulsive, little as the emergency might call for, the *radical carpet-baggers*, *united* and *disunited*, to seek to sex, may be seen hounding their parents of partition and return to the degenerate power of party, meeting, weaving, and abiding the robes of the military, from a superimposed military in the throng of corrupting influences, which have constantly vexed the party of the slaves, and are waging as the world's war, for a false party, for the sake of its money, for a mere amalgam to add to the result of color and consequence against the Federal. Bullying, swindling, and domineering policies, one of iniquity, lawlessness, and violence, who ever knew geometry or perspective, or the true rules of proportion, prepared for despots who have disclosed to the world of action, and most emphatically in union with the unscrupulous and influential party leaders, the one to corroborate the other, to secure the trial of those under the *bonds of suspicion*, and to do the *law and duty* work of exposing, while the latter gave birth to character to the enterprise.

The following are selected from the various articles and sections of this new Constitution:

### THE LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

All legislative powers shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives, and a Census.

The New York *World* of Tuesday, gets up a capital satire on Radcliff, in the shape of a burlesque Constitution, purporting to have been presented in caucus in the first month of the New Era, by Thaddeus Stevens, for the people, and unanimously adopted. The preamble reads:

"We, the members of the Radical party of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, seem to ourselves the powers which by the grace of God, Gaffer, and Greenbacks, we have been enabled to seize, insure our prosperity as a party, provide for the common solvency of our subjects, promote our general welfare, and secure the blessings of plenitude to ourselves and our posterity, ordain and establish this Constitution in the United States."

The following are selected from the various articles and sections of this new Constitution:

THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The executive power of the United States shall be vested in a President, who shall be an officer, to be known as the President, who shall hold his office during the term of four years.

The following are selected from the various articles and sections of this new Constitution:

### THE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.

The judicial power of the United States shall be vested in Congress. There shall be an officer, to be known as the President, who shall hold his office during the term of four years.

The duties of the President shall be to sign all bills and resolutions that may be passed by Congress, and to appoint to the various subordinate administrative offices such persons as may be designated, for by the Congress, or by Congress individually, or by prominent members of the Union League.

*The Congress shall have power to do any thing.*

No tax or duty may be laid upon articles exported from any State, provided that preference shall be given by all commercial regulations, to the ports of the States of Massachusetts, Maine and Rhode Island.

The Congress shall have full authority over the lives, liberty, and property of the people of the various States.

Old Satrapies may be excluded from this Union, at the pleasure of the Congress, whatever their population or wealth may be, but no colony shall be considered sufficient to warrant perpetual exclusion, except the offence of perpetual hostility to the Radical party.

### THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The judicial power of the United States shall be vested in Congress. The trial of all trials known as the Supreme Court is hereby abolished, and the persons holding it as Justices of the Court are hereby declared outlaws.

Trial by jury is hereby abolished.

Treason against the United States shall consist in opposing the Radical party, and affording aid and comfort to the enemies thereof, including the Radical party, and in such other things as the Congress or the Union League may declare treasonable.

The religion of the residents of the United States shall be worshipped the negro. There shall be, hereafter, an anti-slavery Bill and anti-slavery Ordinance.

### MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

Freedmen of speech and of the press shall be controlled exclusively by the Congress. Any person who shall publish a newspaper in opposition to the Radical party may be imprisoned at night.

No resident shall be secure in his person, home, papers and effects, against seizures and searches commanded by Congress. Warrants may issue upon any case.

Persons arrested may be tried at the convenience of the parties procuring their arrest.

Nothing in this Constitution contained shall be held to affect the supreme power of Congress over all persons and things.

This Constitution may be amended at the suggestion of the Caucus, and in accordance with the desires of a majority of the House of Representatives.

The right of suffrage, commonly known as the right to vote, being an inherent and inborn right in every person, and coming, like reading and writing, by nature, shall be enjoyed by every resident of the United States, without regard to the age, sex, race or color of the suffragan; and this right shall never be abridged except in the cases of such persons as may "willfully and" "unlawfully oppose the radical party, who shall only vote upon consent of the Congress, and whose votes shall not, under any circumstances be counted for or against any body or anything."
