"The high price this staple is now commanding is owing to the fact that the demand is greater than the supply. The principle that the supply regulates the demand is so well established in political economy, and has been fully illustrated by all the great masters of that science. The farmer will force a decline in the price of his surplus. That point is more easily reached than many suppose. The present attitude of high prices has the tendency to augment the cultivation beyond the profitable increase of consumption. A planter plucks his crop when it is twenty eight cents per bushel, and then the price falls to ten cents per bushel.
