The Legislature of North Carolina. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. EVENING SESSION. THURSDAY, MARCH 17.

The House was called to order at half past 7 o'clock.

On motion of Mr. Foster, the bill in favor of J. E. Eldridge of Bladen County, was taken up and passed its several readings.

On motion of Mr. French, the bill to incorporate the Hibernia Cemetery in the County of Wake, was taken up and passed its several readings.

On motion of Mr. French, the Senate resolution paying witnesses summoned by the joint committee on investigation of the session of 1868-69, was taken up and adopted.

By Mr. Green: A bill to amend chapter 68 of the laws 1868-69.

The bill passed its several readings under a suspension of the rules.

On motion of Mr. Hoddie, the bill in favor of G. N. Lewis, of Nash County, was taken up and passed its several readings.

By Mr. Durham: A bill to incorporate the North Carolina Fertilizing Co. Referred.

SPECIAL ORDER. The bill authorizing the sale of certain lands.

SECTION 1. That authority is hereby given to the Board of Education, to permit a sale of the lands held by the said Board in the County of Hyde, Tyrrel and Washington for the sum of thirty thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. That the said lands shall be disposed of to actual settlers, and that the deed to be made shall be within one hundred families of bona fide settlers are located upon the lands.

SEC. 3. That the navigation of the lands shall be free to all persons, subject to a right in the State to impose tolls which shall be spent exclusively in repairing or enlarging said canal or Pango River, from the mouth of the Pango Lake canal downwards to Lenoirville.

SEC. 4. That all land owners on the canal may drain into them subject only to such general regulations as now are, or hereafter shall be made by the General Assembly.

SECTION 2. That the act entitled "An act to amend the Charter of the Western North Carolina Railroad Company" ratify the act of the 16th of August 1868, and that the same be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

SECTION 3. That the subscription of stock shall be regulated so that not less than one per cent shall be paid on or before the 1st of May 1870, and no individual stockholder shall be allowed to vote, except in proportion to the amount of stock actually paid or secured by bond with at least two solvent sureties, or mortgage of lands, to be approved by the Directors on the part of the State.

SECTION 4. That the term of office of the present Directors of said Western Division of the Western North Carolina Railroad, shall expire on the 1st day of May 1870; and it is hereby made the duty of the Governor by Proclamation to order a meeting of the stockholders of said Railroad Company on the 1st of May 1870, when the private stockholders shall elect their Directors who in conjunction with those appointed for the State, shall immediately proceed to the election of President and the reorganization of the Company as herein prescribed.

SECTION 5. That the said stockholders do not exceed a number of more than one hundred persons, and the said Company shall be entitled to vote to the amount of judicial stock, represented in person or by proxy.
