THE NORTH CAROLINA ELECTION. The Old North State appears to have been too much reconstructed to answer radical ends. Governor Holden made a bold stroke to save the State to his party by raising the Ku Klux phantom and declaring several strongly democratic counties in several strongly democratic counties in a state of insurrection; but even these des-perate measures proved futile, and North Carolina has gone democratic by ten thou-sand majority. Both branches of the Leg-sisters are largely democratic, which se-cures the election of a democrat to the United States Senate in the place of Abbott, whose term expires with the present Con-gress. The radicals elect only two of the seven Congressines. This crushing defeat of the republicant was most enerspected, as it was deemed certain before the election that they would carry at least four Con national districts, and no fears were en-ternined concerning the Legislature. Un-looked for as was the result by the North Carolina republicana, still it is but the nat-ural sequence of the maladministration of affairs in that State.
