There are at present three times as many persons feeding upon public office as we have ever had before, and the consequences are that there are three times as many who are exerting themselves to keep up the state of things. There are those who maintain, who are extremely anxious for office and who will accept through remuneration. These must be watched.

We tell our friends, those who voted with us of every shade of opinion, that the ship of State has been run upon the rocks and is held in a life and death struggle with the people whether they can get her off or whether she can survive or not. With twenty-eight or thirty millions of public debt upon the State, which must be acknowledged to have been contracted according to law, with fifty or sixty millions of private debt due by the people in and out of the State, and a population of three millions of people, except by the most extraordinary economy, the most rigid care and prudence in our expenditures, and the most decided energy, industry and enterprise.

Retrenchment must therefore come in every department. The Executive office, the offices of the Treasurer, the Auditor, the Secretary of State, the Superintendent of Public Works, Superintendent of Public Schools, Attorney General, Adjutant General, Public Buildings &c. must be thoroughly examined and retrenched of all unnecessary expenditures. Some of the Executive and Judicial departments. Our public charities must be revised. The State expenditures for the University, the Lunatic Asylum and the Institutions for the Deaf, Dumb and the Blind are greater than the impoverished condition of the State will bear. Salaries and fees must be reduced. This is one of the chief sources of expenditure to the people of the State, but which has been greatly overlooked.

Our people are growing impatient, restless, utterly dissatisfied at paying Court Clerks and Sheriffs ten to fifteen thousand dollars a year, instead of fifteen hundred and two thousand. They will not submit to this waste any longer. They have no idea of paying a County Register two or three thousand dollars, County Commissioners and Justices of the Peace ten, &c. and heretofore these public duties were performed free of expense to the people. We have had a general rule making officers, less capable, for the last two years that the State ever had before, and it is costing us three or four times as much.

The people of North Carolina must break down the idea which is growing among us, that politics is a trade that public office is a reward for partisan services, and that every man in the State is entitled to every hundred, to be supported in every way at the public expense. Let public office and public offices be reduced to the lowest possible number. Have no more than are needed, and let their compensation be such as they can support and can be gotten to fill them in a living peace.
