SOUTH CAROLINA.

The New State Constitution as Adopted by the Convention. The Charleston Courier, of September 29, publishes the complete revised Constitution of South Carolina, as adopted by the State Convention on the 27th ult.

Representation is placed, as heretofore, upon the joint basis of the amount of all taxes raised, whether direct or indirect, and the number of white inhabitants in each election district.

One Senator is assigned to each judicial district, except in the judicial district of Charleston, which constitutes, under the present arrangement, two election districts.

The House of Representatives remains the same in number, with the proviso that no one election district shall be assigned more than twelve representatives.

The veto power has been substituted in the General Assembly for the veto by ballot. The office of Governor, which has in a measure been nominal in its character, is invested with great power.

The Lieutenant Governor, also elected by the people, becomes by virtue of his office the President of the Senate, and succeeds to the chair of state in case of a vacancy.

The law is to be administered by superior and inferior courts, to be directed and established by the legislature. The judges of the Superior Court to be elected by it for the term of good behavior.

The qualifications for suffrage are the same as before with an exception made in favor of emigrants from Europe.

The clause in relation to involuntary servitude asserts, first, that the slaves have been emancipated by the action of the United States authorities.

The Alabama Convention has adopted a memorial to the President asking a general amnesty; also a resolution requesting the withdrawal of all the troops from the State.
