PROCLAMATION, BY WILLIAM W. HOLDEN, PROVISIONAL GOVERNOR, TO THE PEOPLE OF NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS A Convention of the people of North Carolina has been chosen in pursuance of the proclamation of Andrew Johnson, President of the United States, of date May 29th, 1865...

enabled, and it is hereby declared and ordained, That Slavery and involuntary servitude, otherwise than for crimes, whereof the parties shall have been duly convicted, shall be and is hereby forever prohibited within this State.

AN ORDINANCE

Submitting to the qualified voters of the State, the ratification or rejection of certain ordinances: Be it ordained by the delegates of the people of North Carolina...

Be it further ordained, That the Sheriffs or other Officers who may ascertain the result of the polls in each County, shall transmit the same to the Provisional Governor...
