NEWS BY THE MAILS.

From Washington.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—The rumor is current that the President, during the recess, will issue a proclamation declaring the rebellion at an end, and placing all the States in the same position as they were previous to the war.

It is said that the French Minister has become quite alarmed respecting the answer of Secretary Seward sent to the Emperor's letter asking for the recognition of Maximilian's government in Mexico, and as much so with reference to the resolutions lately introduced in Congress on the subject of the Monroe doctrine.

Advices from Havana and Vera Cruz state that additional forces are being forwarded to Mexico; twenty-five hundred French troops had already arrived at latter port.

There is great anxiety to ascertain what will be the ultimate action of the United States in regard to Mexico. Among the imperialists they were greatly excited by the last news informing them that Gen. Grant had publicly expressed sympathy with the Republican cause.

Two important decrees were lately issued by Maximilian. One of them extending for fifteen days, from the 29th of November, the time in which the soldiers of President Juarez's Government laying down their arms, to be granted amnesty; and another ordering a general draft for his army throughout Mexico.

WASHINGTON Dec. 13.—The radical ball opened in the House of Representatives this afternoon in committee of the whole, on the usual reference of the President's message to the standing committee.

Mr. Stevens read his carefully prepared manuscript. He started out with the broad declaration that the States lately at war with the government were not in the Union, and that if they were admitted again, they must come in as new States or conquered provinces after passing through territorial condition.

Having conquered them as public enemies, he maintained that the government had the right to treat them as conquered provinces. Among the requirements which he advocated as precedent to the readmission of these States, was the amendment of the Constitution so that there could be an election for President and a representation in Congress on the basis of population.

He proceeded to assume that Congress should control the freedom, or if left to take care of themselves their present condition would be worse than bondage or the horrors of Andromeda. He made light of the ratification of the constitutional amendment abolishing slavery, by the Southern State legislatures, which he denounced as illegal and delusive, and declared that this was not a white man's government, and looked upon Chief Justice Taney's virtual declaration that it was, as the most infamous doctrine of all time!
