It is probable that Secretary Seward, through his written dispatches to Mr. Bigelow, and his live dispatch in the person of General Schofield, has by this time, come to a final understanding with Louis Napoleon in regard to Mexican matters .-The pride and prestige of the French Emperor are to be saved by simply giving him an opportunity to withdraw his support from Maximilian, without menace from the United States, and with the understanding that the United States government will leave Mexico to the Mexicons.

SALE AT POINT LOOKOUT.

The Quartermaster General, upon the recommer.dation of General Grant, has ordered the sale of all the Government buildings at Point Lookout. These include over eighty buildings, some of which are very large. .. The steam laun. dry, used in washing for the Confederate prisoners and United States troops on duty there, together with the wharf timber, will also be sold .-The efforts which have been made through Congrees and the President to have buildings at Point Lookout set apart by the Government for a military and naval asslum delayed action on this subject for some time, but, after a careful consideration of the matter by the authorities, it was deemed advisable to sell the property and to adopt some other method of assisting the philanthropic efforts of the people in behalf of disabled soldiers and seamon.

TELEGRAM FROM GENERAL THOMAS.

Mejor General G. H. Thomas, after having made a tour through the States lately in rebellion, telegraphed to Major General O. O. Howard that after careful investigation he is perfectly satisfied that General Fisk, Assistant Commissioner for Tennessee and Kentucky; General Tilson, Assistant Commissioner for Georgia; General Swayne, Assistant Commissioner for Alabama; and Colonel Thomas, Assistant Commissioner for Mississippi, have administered their offices with fairness and impartiality to whites and blacks, and have been eminently successful in securing a scuse of justice toward the negro from the civil authorities of the States; and, if possible, they should be retained in their present positions as long as they are willing to

The following is the bill passed by both branch es of the Georgia Legislature, to admit negro testimony into the courts:

. The Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Georgia, in General Assembly met, do enact. That from and after the parange of this act, free persons of color shall be competent witnesses in all the courts of this State, in civil eases whereunto a free person of color is a party, and in all criminal cases wherever a free person of color is a defendant, or whenever the offence charged is a crime or misdemeanor against the person or property of a free person of color, any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

Sac. 2. And be it further enacted, That in all eases hereafter pending, or about to be instituted, wherein a free person of color is a party, plaintiff or defendant, it shall be competent for such free person of color to make and file any affidavit now by law allowed and tending to advance the remedy or aid the defendant, as if the said affidavit had been made and filed by any other litigant.

The following is the bill passed by the Alabama Logislature for the protection of the freedmen: A Bill to be entitled an act to protect freedmen in their rights of persons and property in this

Be it enacted, etc., That all freedmen, free negrees and mufattoes, shall have the right to sue and be surd, plead and be impleaded, in all the different and various courts of this State, to the same extent that white persons now have by law ; and they be competent to testify only in open court, and only in cases' in which freedmen, free negroes and mulattoes are parties, either plaintiff or defendant, and in civil or oriminal cases for injuries in the persons and property of freedmen. free negroes and mulattees, and in all cases, civil or criminal, in which under this act a freedman, free negro or mulatto, is a witness against a white person, or a white person against a freed. man, free negro or mulatto, the parties shall be enupetent witnesses, and neither interest in the question or suit, nor marriage, shall disqualify any witness from testifying in open court.
