The Veto of the Civil Rights Bill to be Sustained-Senator Stewart's Position-He supports the President's Policy-Question of Suffrage to be left to the States-The Radicals to effect by Constitutional Amendments the objects of the Votoed Bill-Hegro Suffrage abandoned as a Political Issue-Passage of the Tennessee Resolution doubtful WASHINGTON, March 25.

The opinion gathers strength that the President's veto of the Civil Rights bill will be sussined in the Serat, to which body it will be communicated to-morrow or next day. We hear of no one of the eighteen Senators who sustained the veto of the Freedmen's Bureau Mil who is likely to give way. Mr. Dixon's ab-sence reduces the number to seventeen. The besof one man would not be serious, but a change of two votes would give the Radicals a triumph over the President, and lead to the most disastrous results. It is well, to-day, that Senator Stewart, of Nevada, who was one of sition to the Freedmen's Bureau bill has not been approved by the Legislature of his State. A resolution approving of his vote was rejected in the Nevada Senate by a vote of fifteen to one. He was elected as a Republican, and has not proved his approach to the President's realization. He wishes to go ahead of the President, and his proposition for an adjustment was intended to bring about a complete restoration of southern representation and a general amnety by the 4th of July next. But if the veto be sustained the Radicals threaten that the eleven Southern States shall be evoluded from representation until the vetoed bill, if it be unconstitutional, shall be made constitutional by amendments, not to the bill, but to the Constitution.

Senator Sherman, in his campaign speech in Connecticut, stated that a majority of the Union party in Congress was opposed to the scheme for forcing negro suffrage upon the States, and that a constitutional amendment for that object would not be ratifled by the Northern States. Thus it appears that the Republicans have abandoned negro suffrage, as a political issue, in Connectious in Pennsylvania, and in Ohio, and they will do so in every debateable
