IMPORTANT ACTS OF THE LATE LEGISLATURE.

AN ACT TO IMPROVE THE LAW OF EV IDENCE

WHEREAS, The enquiry after truth in courts of justice is often obstructed by incapacities created by the present law, and it is desirable that full information as to the facts in issue, both in criminal and civil cases, should be laid before the persons appointed to decide upon them, and that such persons should exercise their judgment on the credit of the witnesses adduced, and on the truth of their testimony : now therefore.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assem bly of the State of North Carolina, and it is here-by enacted by the authority of the same, as follows: That no person offered as a witness shall here-after be excluded by reason of incapacity from interest or crime, from giving evidence, either in person or by deposition, according to the practice of the court, on the trial of any issue oined, or of any matter or question, or on any inquiry arising in any suit or proceeding, civil or criminal, in any court or before any judge, justice, jury, or other person having by law authority to hear, receive and examine evidence; and every person so offered shall be admitted to give evidence, notwithstanding such person may or shall have an interest in the matter in

either vice roce or by deposition, according to the practice of the court, in behalf of either or any of the parties to said suit or other proceed-

SEC. 5. Nothing contained in the second section of this act shall sender any person who, in any criminal proceeding, is charged with the commission of an indictable of mace, competent or compellable to give serblence for or against himself, or shall render any person compellable to answer any question tending to criminate himself, or shall in any criminal profile and the second ceeding render any husband competent or compellable to give evidence for or against his wife. or any wife competent or compellable to give evidence for or against her husband.

SEC. 4. Nothing contained in the second section of this set shall apply to any suit or other proceeding in any court of law or equity, insti-tated in consequence of adultery, or to any action for breach of promise of marriage or for criminal conversation, and nothing contained in the first section of this act shall apply to the attesting

witnesses to wills.

AN ACT TO PREVENT WILFUL TRES-PASSES ON LANDS, AND STEALING ANY KIND OF PROPERTY THERE-

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Ashereby enacted by the authority of the same. That no person, after being forbidden to do so, shall enter on the premises of another without a bicense therefor; and if any person, after being thus forbidden, shall so enter, he shall be deen-

chase therefor; anni any personal to deventus forbidden, shall so enter, he shall be devented guilty of a misdemeanor. And if any person, not being the present owner or bona fide claimant of such premises, shall wilfully and unlawfully enter thereon, and carry off, or be engaged in the act of carrying off, any wood or other kind of property whalsoever, growing, or being thereon, the same being the property of the owner of the premises, or under his control, keeping or care, such person shall, if the act be done with felonious intent, be deemed guilty of larceny, and punished as for that offence. And if not done with such intent, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor: Provided, heaceer, that any person who may make a written affidavit before a justice of the peace of the county, that any of his cattle or other live stock, (which shall be speculiy described and set forth in such affidavit) has strayed away, and he has good reason to believe that it is on the he has good reason to believe that it is on the premises of another or other persons, then such justice may, in his discretion, allow such person to enter our said premises, with one or more servants, without firearms, in the day time, aday excepted.) between the hours of sunrise and sunset, and make search for his estray for such limited than as to said justice shull appear reasonable; but the only effect of such license aball he spear reasonable; but the only effect of such license shall be to protect the persons entering, from indictment therefor, and then only, provided the license shall have been made bona fide, and without any damage except such, as was necessary to conduct the search.

AN ACT TO SECURE TO AGRICULTURAL LABORERS THEIR PAY IN KIND.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assem by of the State of North Carolina, and it is here by stated by the authority of the same, That whenever servants and laborers in Agriculture shall, by their contracts in writing, already or hereafter made, be entitled, for wages, to a part of the crops cultivated by them, such part shall not be subject to sale under executions, against their employers, at the owners of the land cul-

AN ACT TO PUNISH PERSONS PERSUING AND INJURING HORSES AND OTHER LIVE STOCK, WITH INTENT TO STEAL

AN ACT TO PUNISH VAGRANCY.

Secrion 1. Be it enacted by the General Assem bly of the State of North Carolina, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That if any person who may be able to labor, has no apparent means of subsistence, and neglects to apply himself to some honest occupation for apply fitness? To some honest occupation for the support of himself and his family, if he have one; or, if any person whatever shall be found spending his time in dissipation, or gam-ing, or sauntering about without employment, or endeavoring to maintain himself or his family by any undue or unlawful means, such person shall be deconed a vagrast, and guilty of a mis-demeanor. And it shall be the duty of any justice of the peace of the county wherein such persons shall be found, upon due proof of such offence, to issue a warrant for the arrest of the offender, to be brought before him or some other justice of the peace, whose duty it shall be, if, on examination, such person shall be found a vagrant, to recognize him with good, security for his appearance, at the first Court to be held for said county, whether it be a Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions or a Superior Court, to answer such offence. And if he fail to give may or shall have an interest in the matter in question, or in the event of the trial of the is such recognizance, he shall be impaisoned until question, or in the event of the trial of the is often of said court: Provided, however, That, if such offender shall, at the said Court, e is offered as a witness.
