## SCHEDULE OF STAMP DUTIES.

FROM AND AFTER AUGUST 1, 1864.

### Acknowledgement.

Of debts.  
Affidavit.

Affidavit in suits or legal proceedings  
Agreement.

Or Appraisal, if on each sheet, or  
piece of paper on which the same is written.

Assignment,  
Or transfer of mortgage, lease, or policy  
of insurance, the same duty as the  
original instrument.

Assignment of patent right.

Bank Checks.

Drafts or orders, &c., at sight or on demand

Bills of Exchange.

[FOREIGN.]  
(Foreign), drawn in, but payable out of,  
the United States, each bill of set of three  
or more, \$1.00 stamped.

For every bill of exchange, where the  
amount payable does not exceed one  
hundred dollars, or the equivalent thereof  
in any foreign currency in which bills  
may be expressed, according to the  
standard of value fixed by the United  
States

For every additional hundred dollars,  
or fractional part thereof, in excess of  
one hundred dollars

(Foreign), drawn in, but payable out of,  
the United States, (if drawn singly or in  
duplicate), pay the same duty as inland  
Bills of Exchange.

The acceptor, drawers, or any Bill  
of Exchange, or order for the payment of  
any sum of money drawn, or purporting  
to be drawn, in any foreign country, but  
payable in the United States, must, before  
paying or accepting the same, place  
thereon a stamp indicating the duty.

Bills of Exchange.

[INLAND.]  
(Inland, draft or order) payable either  
at sight or on demand, and any  
provisory note, whether payable on demand  
or at a time designated, (exempt  
bank notes, issued for circulation, and  
checks made, and intended to be, and  
which shall be, forthwith presented for  
payment), for a sum not exceeding one  
hundred dollars

For every additional \$100, or fractional  
part thereof.

The warrant of attorney, or  
power of attorney, or power of  
judgment on a note or bond (exempt  
from stamp duty, if the note or bond is  
properly stamped.)

Bills of Lading.

Of bills of lading from ports of the United  
States to British North America.

Bills of lading or receipt for goods to  
any port of the United States

Bills of Sale.

Of any vessel, or part thereof, when the  
consignment does not exceed five hundred  
tons.

Bill of sale exceeding \$1,000, and not ex-

ceeding \$10,000.

Bill of sale exceeding \$1,000, for each  
\$100, or fractional part thereof.

Bill of sale of personal property,  
(other than ship or vessel.)

Bonds.

Personal, for the payment of money.  
(See Mortgage.)

Bond.

Bond for indemnifying any person for  
the payment of any sum of money, when  
ultimately recoverable therefrom, \$1,000,  
or less.

Bond where the money recoverable ex-

Bond of any description, other than  
such as are required in legal proceedings,  
and such as are not otherwise charged in  
this Schedule.

Certificates.

Of deposit in bank, sum not exceeding  
one hundred dollars.

Certificates of deposit in bank, sum  
exceeding one hundred dollars.

Certificates of stock in an incorporated  
company.

Certificates, general.

Certificates of record upon the instru-

ment recorded.

Certificate of weight or measurement  
of animals, coal, wood, or other articles, ex-

cept weights and measures returns.

Certificate of a qualification of a Ju-

stice of the Peace, Commissioner of Deeds,  
or Notary Public.

Certificates of search of records.

Certificates that certain papers are on

file.

Certificates that certain papers cannot be  
found.

Certificates of redemption of land sold  
for taxes.

Certificates of birth, marriage, and  
death.

Certificates of qualification of school  
teachers.

Certificates of profits in an incorpo-

rated company for a sum not less than \$10,  
and not exceeding \$50.

Certificates exceeding \$50, and not ex-

ceeding \$100.

Certificates exceeding 1,000, for every  
additional \$1,000 or fractional part thereof.

Certificates of damage, or otherwise  
and all other certificates or documents  
issued by any port master, marine ser-

vicer, or other person acting as such.

Certified Transcripts.

Of judgments, satisfaction of judg-

ments, and of all papers recorded on file

(N.B.—as a general rule, every cer-

tificate which has, or may have, a legal  
value in any court of law, or equity, will

require a stamp duty of 8cts.

Charter Party.

Or leases, memoranda, or other writ-

ings between the captain, owner, and  
agent of any ship, vessel, or steamer, and  
other persons, or the charterer of the char-

ter, if the registered tonnage of said ship, vessel, or steamer does not exceed  
one hundred and fifty tons.

Charter party exceeding one hundred  
and fifty tons, and not exceeding three  
hundred tons.

Charter party exceeding three hundred
