SCHEDULE OF STAMP DUTIES.

FROM AND AFTER AUGUST 1, 1864.

Table of Stamp Duties with columns for document type (e.g., Acknowledgement, Affidavit, Agreement, Assignment, Bank Checks, Bills of Exchange, Bills of Lading, Bills of Sale, Bonds, Certificates, Charter Party, Contract, Conveyance, Endorsement, Entry, Gauger, Insurance, Lease, Manifest, Mortgage, Pawns Checks, Pension Paper, Passage Tickets, Power of Attorney, Probate of Will, Protest, Promissory Note, Quit Claim Deed, Receipts, Sheriff's Return, Trust Deed) and corresponding rates.

Check. Or order for the payment of any sum of money exceeding \$10, drawn upon any person other than a bank, banker or trust company, at sight or on demand. 2 cts.

Contract. (See Agreement.) Contract, broker's. 10 cts.

Conveyance. Deed, instrument, or writing whereby land, tenements, or other realty sold, shall be conveyed, the actual value of which does not exceed \$100. 50 cts.

Endorsement. Of any negotiable instrument. exempt.

Entry. Of any goods, wares, or merchandise at any custom house, either for consumption or warehouse, not exceeding one hundred dollars in value. 25 cts.

Gauger. Return, for quantity not exceeding 500 gallons, if gauging. 10 cts.

Insurance. (Marine, inland, and fire,) who is the consideration, paid for the insurance, in cash, or in notes, or both, does not exceed \$1. 10 cts.

Lease. Of lands or tenements, where rent does not exceed \$100 per annum. 50 cts.

Manifest. For custom house entry, or clearance of the cargo of any ship, vessel, or steamer for a foreign port, if the registered tonnage of such ship, vessel, or steamer does not exceed 300 tons. 50 cts.

Mortgage. Trust deed, bill of sale, or personal bond for the payment of money exceeding \$10, and not exceeding \$50. 50 cts.

Warehouse Receipts. For any goods, wares, or merchandise, not otherwise provided for, deposited or stored in any public or private warehouse, not exceeding \$100 in value. 10 cts.

Writs and Legal Documents. Writ, or other original process by which any suit is commenced in any court of record, either of law or equity. 10 cts.

GENERAL REMARKS. Revenue stamps may be used indiscriminately upon any of the matters or things enumerated in this schedule, except proprietary and playing card stamps, for which a special law has been provided.

An Act to regulate the terms of the Supreme Court and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina, that it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, as follows: Sec. 1. That the terms of the Supreme Court shall be published in the City of Raleigh, for six consecutive weeks after the first Monday of January in each year, beginning on the second Monday of January and June instead of the terms now prescribed by law.
