A PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency, JONATHAN WORTH,

GOVERNOR OF NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, it has been represented to me that JOSEPH SLADE, late of the County of Wake in said State, was charged with the murder of one W. L. Part, late of said county and State, and that the said slayings are a flagrant violation of justice and has escaped being punished.

Now, therefore, in order that the said slayings may be avenged and he might be tried, lie the said alleged murderer, JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of said State, do issue his proclamation, offering the reward of FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS for his apprehension and delivery to the Sheriff of said County of Wake, or to any other person who shall apprehend him.
