STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA. \$400 REWARD. A PROCLAMATION. By His Excellency, JONATHAN WORTH, GOVERNOR OF NORTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, It has been represented to me that JOSEPH SCOTT, late of the County of Wake in said State, stands charged with the murder of one W. L. Fort, late of said county and State, and that said Scott is a fugitive from justice and has escaped beyond the limits of the State: Now, in pursuance of an order that said Scott may be arrested and brought to trial, for the said alleged murder, I, JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of said State, do issue this my proclamation, offering the reward of FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS for his apprehension and delivery to the Sheriff of said County of Wake.

In witness thereof, His Excellency, Jonathan Worth, Governor of said State, has signed his hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed. Done, at the City of Raleigh, this 23rd day of August A. D. 1866. JONATHAN WORTH, By His Excellency, JONATHAN WORTH, WM. H. BAILEY, Private Secretary. DESCRIPTION. JOSEPH SCOTT is represented to be about 20 years of age—5 feet, 6 or 7 inches high—dark hair—blue eyes, round face—full lips—nose slightly inclined to turn up—dorsal complexion—has rather a down look—in conversation draws out his words long and loud—wears No. 5 shoes, and generally black clothes.
