As executor of Dr. Hugh J. Davis, to effect a division among his legatees, I shall sell to the highest bidder, on the 15th day of November, 1866, at his late residence, in the town of Warrenton, N. C., the DWELLING HOUSE and LOT. Also a Lot in front of Dwelling, and a Lot adjoining the Court-House square and a tract of Land about two miles distant from Warrenton.

The Dwelling is in cottage style, containing ten rooms, and has two basements. Near the center of the town, surrounded by magnificent oaks, it is in one of the handsomest locations in Warrenton, on a lot of about four and a half acres, having an ample yard and garden well inclosed, with Stables, Kitchen, Smoke House, Dairy, Carriage House, Corn Crib, Servants' House, two good Offices in the yard, a well of excellent water, and is bounded by four streets. Being so near Warrenton by a good road, this tract is valuable for its fire wood, having been reserved for this purpose, but would make a nice farm.
