STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA.

A PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of North Carolina.

Whereas, it has been represented to me, that J. K. MORROW, late of the County of Cherokee, in said State, stands charged with the murder of HIRSH A. BOONE, of said County and State, and that the said MORROW is a fugitive from justice;

Now, therefore, in order that the said MORROW may be arrested and brought to trial for said alleged murder, I, JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of said State, do issue this my Proclamation, directing the Sheriff of each County in this State, to cause the said MORROW to be arrested, and to deliver to the Sheriff of Cherokee County.

In witness whereof, His Excellency, JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of said State, has hereunto set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed.

Done at the City of Raleigh, this 23rd day of November, A. D. 1866.
