A PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of North Carolina:

WHEREAS, it has been represented to me, that JAMES A. MORROW, late of the County of Cherokee, in this State, was accused with the murder of Harlan A. Boone, of said County and State, and that said Morrow is a fugitive from justice:

Now, therefore, in order that the said Morrow may be arrested and brought to trial, for said alleged murder, I, JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of said State do, by virtue of the power and authority of the same, issue an executive warrant, commanding the Sheriff of the County of Cherokee, to arrest the said Morrow, and bring him before the Sheriff of Cherokee County.

In witness whereof, His Excellency, JONATHAN WORTH, Governor of said State, has hereunto set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed.

Done at the City of Raleigh, this 22d day of November, A. D. 1866.
