WASHINGTON, January 19, 1867. If indications were wanting of the purpose of Radical leaders to promote the proposed impachment of the President, we have them in the change of tone on the subject on the part of some influential public journals.

The Judiciary Committee will prepare a report evidence enough for the purpose of sustaining the articles of impachment, which they will report before March.

With much interest we look to the result of the motion which Mr. Bingham, of Ohio, will make to commit Stevens' "anarchy bill" to the Committee on Reconstruction.
