Our Tuesday Morning Dispatches.

Washington, Jan. 28.

The President's veto of the Colorado bill was sent in to day and is as follows: I return the act admitting Colorado. A sense of duty prevents my approval.

The additional section makes the bill more objectionable. The Constitution of Colorado promises that the laws existing shall continue. Among these is one absolutely prohibiting suffrage.

The President submits evidence of the rapid growth of the people of Colorado to a State government. The total population of Colorado is 27,809, only one fifth of what is required for Congressional representation.

He shows by statistics that other States, when admitted, had a population entitling them to one and nearly two representatives. Every organized Territory equally with Colorado is entitled to admission.
