MEETINGS OF COMMISSIONERS.—At a special meeting of the Board of Commissioners, held on Tuesday evening, the following members were present: Wm. D. Haywood, Mayor; Messrs. J. D. Boyter, A. T. Sawyer, J. O. Orrery, B. F. Chestnut, J. A. Moore, D. L. Royler and J. H. Betts, Commissioners.

THE CHATHAM RAILROAD COMPANY was chartered in the year 1851. By an ordinance of the State Convention, passed the 30th of January, 1862, corporate bodies and towns were authorized to make subscriptions for stock in the same, and to raise their subscriptions, it was allowed them to deposit their bonds with the Public Treasurer of the State.

THE CHATHAM RAILROAD COMPANY and sundry individuals had afterwards made large subscriptions for stock in the Chatham R. R. Company, which were paid, most of them, in Confederate money, when greatly depreciated, some in cotton yarns, at 45¢ per pound, which could be used by the Company in purchasing supplies.

TELEGRAPHIC. Thursday-Morning Dispatches. FORTIETH CONGRESS. WASHINGTON, March 13, P. M. The House was in committee of the whole on the bill appropriating \$1,000,000 to the destitute of the South.

Mr. Wood opened the measure, and said the South only wanted civil rights and Northern capital to develop their resources.
