DEATH OF HON. D. F. CALDWELL.

We announce, with pain, the death of this distinguished man, which occurred in this City on Thursday, in the 76th year of age. Judge Caldwell was a native of Ireland County, where he was born in 1792. He was educated at Chapel Hill, and read law with the late Hon. Archibald Henderson, the profession of which he early rose to eminence. He first entered public life as a member of the House of Commons from Ireland County in the year 1816. He subsequently removed to Salsbury, and represented Hinckley in the Senate of our State Legislature in the years 1820, '21 and '22. In 1824 he was elected a member of the Superior Courts of Law and Equity, which position he held with honor to himself and credit to the State, until he resigned in 1828.

Judge Caldwell was a man of no ordinary intellectual power. As a lawyer he was for many years the acknowledged head of the bar of the Circuit in which he practiced. As a Judge few men have inspired more good will and respect among the legal profession, and none ever inspired a higher reverence for the administration of justice among common people. He was a man of undivided integrity, a high sense of honor, and though he may have had no contend with strong prejudices, a kind and generous heart.

It was not our good fortune to have known him very long or very intimately, but we have not the material at hand to write any very extended notice of him to day; but we trust such notice will be prepared by some of his old associates at the bar, whose personal reminiscences of him would prove of the highest interest. It is true that he belonged to a generation of lawyers which has never passed away, but we have in our mind one of his survivors who is eminently qualified to furnish a sketch of his life and character, and we hope that he will undertake this task.—*Old North Star.*

OHIO SUFFRAGE.
COLUMBUS, Ohio, April 7.
The Senate has concurred in the House amendment to the suffrage bill, extending the franchises to all male citizens, except Indians and deserters.

REVOLUTION IN HAITI.

BOSTON, April 6.—A private letter from Port au Prince of March 24, confirms the reported revolution in Hayti. President Gifford has resigned and left the Island in a French man of war.

MILITARY CONSTRUCTION.—We have official information that on yesterday Colonel Frank, the military commandant of this post, was applied to by some friends of Nicholas Carr, the prisoner sentenced to be hanged by the Court, to telegraph to General Simkins, commanding this military district, in order to ascertain whether or not Carr was being construed as a murderer under the late order prohibiting the infliction of whipping, flogging or otherwise ill-treating the person as a punishment. Col. Frank declined making any action in this matter, unless applied to by counsel for the prisoner.

Shortly afterwards, we understand, this same request was made to Col. Frank, by one of the counsel for the defense.

A telegram was then dispatched to Gen. Steddy to effect, and in the afternoon of his Honor, Judge Meares, received communication from Col. Frank, stating that General Steddy had been heard from in this case, and that branding had been construed as meaning. Col. Frank, in accordance with this information, requested that Judge Meares would inflict some other punishment upon the prisoner Carr. The action of the Judge will be shown to day, when the prisoner is brought into court.
