IMPORTANT ORDER BY GENERAL

HRADO'RS, SECOND MILITARY DIST., Charleston, S. C., April 11, 1867. The general destitution prevailing among the population of this military district can not be relieved without affording means for the development of their industrial resour

ces. The nature and extent of the destitu tion demand extraordinary measures. The people are borns down by a neavy burden of delet; the crops of grain and garden produce failed last year; many lamilies have been deprived of shelter, many more need food and clothing; needful implements and anxiliaries of husbandry are very searce; the laboring population in numerous localities are threatened with attravation unless supplied with food by the government of the United States; the inability of a large portion of speepole to pay taxes leaves the local authorities without adequate means of relief, and the gravity of the situation is increased by the general disposition shown by crediture to enture upon an impovertised people the lammediate collection of all chains. To suffer all this to go on without restraint or femerly is to sacrifice the general good. The rights of creditors shall be respected, but the appeal of want and saffering must be heesled. Moved by these considerations, the following regulations are announced, and they will continue in force, with such modification as the occasion may require, until the civil government of the respective States shall be established in accordance with the requirements of these regulations, and the co-operation of silpersons concerned in employing fairly and justly the advantages still remaining to them, will mittgate the distures now existing, and into the expective States shall be established in accordance with the requirements of the government of the united States.
