If the white men of this State, who have not been disfranchised, will take care to register and vote, they will not only secure, beyond the possibility of danger, their political rights and property, but they will be in condition to aid in the work of speedy registration upon terms not as disadvanta-geous as they would be made by the tri-

mph of Radicalism.
It is full time, also, that the people should be selecting able, fair-ininded and Conser-vative candidates for the Convention. We should not be governed by the political an-tecedents of those candidates, when the re-quired qualities for a good delegate are found, combined with eligibility for the

At a time like this he has no more right to refuse than a soldier has to lead a charge, or a clergyman to deny his pious services to the sick. We do not suppose that any Virgin ia gentleman will derive pleasure or satis-faction from being a member of a Conven-tion called by a military ruler who is enforcing an act of Congress with the bayo-net, but the question to be considered is one of grave and imperative duty and not of pleasure or of mere ambition."


