On this continent, the birth-place and natural home of modern republics, our own experiment is the only one to which freemen could ever point with pride; and even ours is brought into doubt and hazard by the events of the last few years. Admitting that our own experiment was long successful, and is yet hopeful, there is little to be said in favor of any of the others.
