But the gift of song, the light, the consecration, and the dream, came to the younger Timrod from God. He did not write for praise; he was a shy, sensitive, shrinking man, who withdrew into himself like the mimosa at the slightest touch; he was always, more or less, an invalid, and was, both from a feeble physique and want of sequalitance with the world, the most ompetent of men in the affairs of life,— t his organization, though imperfect, was not morbid. His heart was always sympathetic, his life was pure, his contemplations exalted, and the purity and elevation of his
