HOW IT WAS DONE AND HOW IT WILL BE UNDONE.

Each day but serves to fasten the conviction upon us that those white men in North Carolina, exceeding in numbers far beyond what we could possibly have anticipated, who voted for the mongrel Constitution, committed a most grave error...

We heard an incident related, a day or two since, which illustrates, at once, the disingenuous expedients which were employed by the Radicals, in the late election, to influence the votes of the timid and unreflecting white men...
