The discussion seems to have been
centering upon the passage of the Com-
mittee's resolution, the probable speedy
admission of all the Southern States, except
Missouri, Virginia, and West Va., to the
Confederacy, and the inauguration of the
new State governments.

The present will go into Congress as
the "representatives" of the South, but they
will go against the most earnest and
emphatic protests of the Southerners.

Resolved, That a copy of the proceedings
of this meeting be forwarded to the Rev.
Albert Nevin, D. D., of Pennsylvania, who
lately visited this place with the view of
selecting a suitable location as a permanent
settlement, and that he be requested to
give them publicity in his State and
wherever he may have opportunity of
doing so, to call attention to the same.

Resolved, That it is most important means
of developing the resources and of propa-
gating the agricultural interest of this country
that our best energies and united efforts
should be exerted to construct, as speedily
as practicable, Railroads from this plateau
some point on the Richmond and Danville
Railroad, a charter for which has already
been obtained.

Resolved, That the representatives only of
ignorant and stupid negroes, and they are hardly
true representatives even of such. They
overlook positions to hold unrepresenting
in mid-night meetings among the negroes, by
which they have educated these deluded
slaves to voting for them at the polls.

They have sprung into life from the rotten-
ness of the times, and have fastened upon
the garments of the body politic. But like
those fellow-creatures, the maggot, they
will bring a brief existence in the sus-
pense of capturing day. Their official life
will soon be terminated when the people of
the South once more are permitted to elect
their true representatives.

This action of Congress has just given
place upon the political condition of the
States included in the bill referred to. We
cannot deny this change if we would, and it
would be folly to do it if we could. The
whole scheme of "Congressional Reconstruc-
tion" is beyond question an outrage and an
iniquity, but it has been perpetrated.
