### POLITICAL FAIR IN WASHINGTON.

A large number of Southern delegates to the New York Convention have arrived here, and the question of platform and nomination is being finally discussed. The delegates to unite on the stronger and best candidate is universally expressed. Strong feeling is being manifested by the delegates actually present from expressing any preference. They express the greatest confidence in being able to carry every Southern State for the Democratic ticket. The delegates from Georgia, and just here, are the most important. It is understood that there will be a declaration by the Convention to the effect that the people are determined to have a fair election. Such a notice being deemed necessary for two reasons—first, that the Jacobins may be fully apprised in advance that they will not be allowed to occupy the Executive office by violence, outrage or fraud; and secondly, to arouse those who have of late years come to think that radical outrages were not to be resisted, to the fact that the time has come to maintain the Constitution and the law. There have been some indications that a plan will be proposed by which Congress would exclude such States as might be necessary to secure to the present dominant party the Presidential election. The time for such plotting to be successful has passed. There will have to be a fair election, and before the Radical candidate will be allowed to assume the duties of the Presidential office, he will have to be fairly elected according to the forms of the Constitution. Such a declaration one hears on every side, and hence it is the declared purpose of the delegates to the Convention to insist on giving the proper notice to all whom it may concern.

With a fair election, it is believed that every Southern State will follow the example of Mississippi and roll up a Democratic majority. Mississippi has the largest registered negro vote in the South next to South Carolina, and yet with a fair ballot it is said to have given a Confederate majority of twenty thousand. The delegates from Georgia as a protest against the Radical party, and more if General Hancock is in the field. The delegates from Alabama and South Carolina say that the Radical party will give up the South. The Radical party and their carpet-bag agents will be by the way of democratized and broken up, and the negroes will be left very much divided, many of them declaring their purpose to abandon their allies and form new associations.

The action of the majority of the House of Representatives in allowing McKee, of Kentucky, to take the seat which Henry Clay had elected, and John D. Young, the member elect, has given great dissatisfaction to the more honest and respectable members of the dominant party, and they are charging Henry Clay with the seat of Illinois, and yesterday they should adopt a standing order that Henry Clay should be expelled from the House, and that Henry Clay should be considered a defunct, and his Radical opponent be allowed his seat. Poland, (Radical) of Vermont, bearing the message, proposes to appoint by declaring that whenever a State did not give 20,000 Democratic majority, the entire Radical ticket should be declared elected.

Such remarks show how utterly disgusted these gentlemen are with the action of their own party. Poland remarked in the Committee which recommended that McKee should be admitted to a seat, that he could not perceive but one objection to what was that that one objection was that Henry Clay had been elected, and as Henry Clay had been elected, and you had a seat, then Henry Clay should be considered a defunct, and his Radical opponent be allowed his seat.

### THE CONSERVATIVE PLATFORM.

Platforms have heretofore had but little efficacy in controlling the ruling powers. They have been mere catchwords to gull and govern the masses, while the leaders have been placed in positions of responsibility, and have been able to disregard the fundamental principles of free government. The Chicago platform, past and present, are made up of empty utterances, calculated to inflame the passions of the masses, and to lead them to the support of a party which they do not understand.

The principles upon which the Democrats and Conservatives stand are, in brief, and to the point. We find them articulated in the following paragraph:

1. General amnesty to white men.
2. A national government.
3. A national army.
4. Civil supremacy.
5. No army of negroes.
6. A reduction of the standing army.
7. Abolition of the Freedmen's Bureau.
8. A limitation of the power of Congress to the abolition of slavery.

These present the real issue between the parties. The Radical party is determined to keep on the negro and military policy; they have pursued and extended the tenure of the negro, and high taxes and a standing army are the natural consequences.
