GENERAL FRANK BLAIR'S LETTER ACCEPTING THE NOMINATION FOR VICE PRESIDENT OF THE DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

General George W. Morgan, Chairman Committee on Resolutions, Democratic Convention, Cambridge— I take the earliest opportunity of replying to your letter, notifying me of my nomination for Vice President of the United States by the National Democratic Convention recently held in the city of New York.
