GEN. WADE HAMPTON'S SPEECH.

THE TRUE POSITION OF CONSERVATIVES AND DEMOCRATS.

PEACE AND UNION—NOT REVOLUTION AND WAR.

The following extract of a speech delivered at Columbia, S. C., by General Wade Hampton, while it meets fully the false charges made against himself, also sets forth the true purpose and design of the Conservatives and Democrats. Our aim is peace, and it is the aim of the entire party:

"But it is our frank purpose now, and has been since the close of the late civil war, to accept and abide by, in good faith and without disturbance, the legitimate fruits and consequences of that war, so far as to the government of the United States a cheerful submission and allegiance; and to perform all the obligations of good citizens to the rightful government, and we do this mainly in seeking freedom on terms of equality in the grand confederacy of States which constitute our nation; and we do so, with the full knowledge that, in contrary, we will be compelled to abdicate its duties, to rebuild our waste places under the protection of its flag, to re-establish the old era of good feeling in our common country, to thwart the designs of unprincipled men everywhere who would perpetuate discord and division, and to partake in the blessings as well as the burdens of the Government."

An incident which occurred at this convention showed the moderation and forbearance of these people. Riotous demonstrations for the purpose of molding a conservative Democratic club in attendance were met by the most temperate and moderate demeanor, and when a Radical Senator threw down a picture of Raymond and Blair, which was posted in one of the hotels, no violence was elicited from the Conservative spectators of the act. We have given this prominence to the popular rage and demeanor of the Raleigh Convention, because it is a faithful index of the desire of the Southerners for conciliation and peace, and presents an admirable example of the wise and intelligent self-control with which they are endeavoring to fulfil their delicate and dangerous purpose to provoke them to opt out, in order to make party strife fruitful there at the North.

WHEREAS, by satisfactory evidence presented to the undersigned, it has been made to appear that THE STATE NATIONAL BANK OF RALEIGH, in the city of Raleigh, in the state of North Carolina, has been duly organized and is according to the requirements of the Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide a National Currency issued by a People of United States Banks, and to prohibit State Banks from issuing bank notes," passed on the 28th day of March, 1863, and is intended to be completed before recommending the business of banking under said act:

Now, therefore, I, Horatio C. Holloman, Commissioner of the Treasury, do, by virtue of the said National Bank of Raleigh, in the city of Raleigh, in the county of Wake, and state of North Carolina, as aforesaid, do, by commission of the said act, establish and charter the same, to commence business, whenever it shall be ready, on the eighteenth day of June, 1865.
