

IN RELATION TO THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF CLERKS OF SUPERIOR COURTS

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact: Section 1. That as this act will be incorporated in the general act respecting the powers and procedure of the courts, required to be reported to the General Assembly at its present session, by the commission appointed for that purpose, it will be printed in the general act...
