CHARLOTTE, Nov. 19, 1868.

I offer my absence from home as an apology to my friend, Geo. W. Mordecai, late President of the Bank of North Carolina, for my seeming want of respect for, or due appreciation of, the advertisement he was kind enough to favor me with in the "Raleigh Sentinel" some weeks since. My friend, Mr. Mordecai, is notorious if he thinks that by his personal controversy with me he can shield himself from the just indignation of his stockholders, at the manner in which he has bankrupted the Bank and thereby destroyed the value of their stock. I shall not trouble the public much with any difference between Mr. Mordecai and myself as to our individual transactions; but I shall, as a stockholder of the Bank of North Carolina, call for an investigation of the manner in which Mr. Mordecai, and his Board of Directors, have squandered my stock, as well as that of other stockholders. As to Mr. Mordecai's charge that the tact of his sending gold to New York, and having it converted into United States Bonds, was not the question stockholders have rights, yet, in this most important of the Bank, Mr. Mordecai has entirely ignored the views of his stockholders. I venture the assertion that this extraordinary assumption of power by Mr. Mordecai and his Directors, to jeopardize the interests of hundreds in North Carolina, without even notifying or consulting them, cannot be approved of by his stockholders.

I charge that the Bank was placed in bankruptcy to tax the stockholders with enormous fees for assignees and attorneys amounting to thirty or forty thousand dollars, and to throw these fees into the hands of the same parties who have *gained* fat on the Bank since the surrender.

I notify the stockholders and the creditors that those same parties will try to control the appointments of assignees; watch out for letters and circulars to that effect. Now, friend Mordecai, in conclusion, let me suggest to you that you gratify me by calling a meeting of the stockholders. I will promise to meet you there, and if I have done you injustice you will have a fair opportunity to set yourself right.
