Now that the Boutwells, the Sumners, and other New England luminaries are reand other New E-giand luminaries are re-solved on taking from the States the right to regulate the suffrage therein, in order the surer to force negro equality upon the country, it is a duty to re-tuvite public at-tention to the great Constitutional Amendment of the future—namely, the great ap-pertion ment of United States Senators according to population—just as members of the House of Representatives are now
