ELECTION! ELECTION! MAYOR'S OFFICE.

In pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Raleigh, that an election will be held on the 8th day of April, 1869, at the Court House, in this City, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and City Commissioners, the following names have been placed in nomination, and the names of the electors are invited to appear at the election, and vote for the Mayor and City Commissioners, and for the purpose mentioned in the following act of the General Assembly of North Carolina.

AN ACT TO ENLARGE THE CITY OF RALEIGH TO BOUND MONEY FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact (chapter 1. That for the purpose of paying present indebtedness of the City of Raleigh, and also for meeting the expense of improvements to be made for the same, the City is hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds severally of such amount and denomination as may be determined by the Board of Commissioners, and to sell the same at such rate and interest as may be determined by the Board of Commissioners, and to use the proceeds of the sale of such bonds for the purposes aforesaid.

Section 1. That the Board of Commissioners of the City of Raleigh are hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds of such amount and denomination as may be determined by the Board of Commissioners, and to sell the same at such rate and interest as may be determined by the Board of Commissioners, and to use the proceeds of the sale of such bonds for the purposes aforesaid.

Section 2. That the Board of Commissioners of the City of Raleigh are hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds of such amount and denomination as may be determined by the Board of Commissioners, and to sell the same at such rate and interest as may be determined by the Board of Commissioners, and to use the proceeds of the sale of such bonds for the purposes aforesaid.
