SUPREME COURT

Tuesday, Jan. 28th. Court assembled at the usual hour, all 100 cases being present on the Bench.

The case of Edward T. Brantner, et al., vs. Zechariah Green, et al., of Rockingham, being set for to-day, was taken up, and argued at length, by Hon. W. H. Battle, for the plaintiff, and Hon. E. R. Phillips, for the defendant.

The argument in the Brantner case was concluded by Hon. W. A. Graham, for the plaintiff.

The principal legal points embraced in the case are:

Whether an order for an injunction can be made by any Judge out of the District in which the action is to be tried, involving the construction of the sections 128, 129, 244, 245, of the Code of Civ. Proc.

Whether the Legislature has authority to authorize the County Commissioners to levy a special tax, to be levied on the property of the County, to be used for the purpose of making a valuation of the property of the County, to be used for the purpose of making a valuation of the property of the County.

Whether the County Commissioners of Rockingham County did not violate the provisions of the Revenue Act of 1888-9, chapter 74, sec. 19, when they undertook to alter the valuation of 1880, by making the valuation of 1880, the standard of the value of the property, instead of simply revising the valuation made by the assessors.

Whether the case called by the name Justice Settle, vacated his seat, as contended of the Bench, during the argument.
